

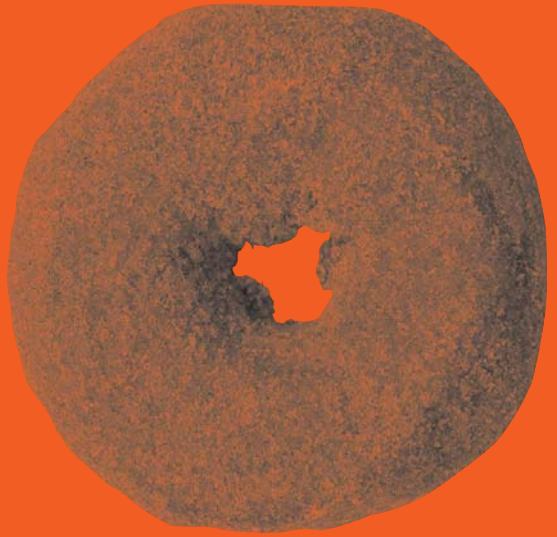
SHANNON BROWN:
